FINALLY . . . CATERING SERVICES SPORTS HERO FUNDAY LUNCH

Every child will receive an invitation to take part in the event and everyone who takes part will have the opportunity to win prizes, if they are lucky enough to discover a golden ticket in their themed meal boxes.

Prizes include sports equipment, admission tickets to various activities such as trampolining, a family ticket to Alnwick Garden and Panto Tickets for the Theatre Royal donated by local organisations.

Your child might be able to have free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit



Plus - all children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 are eligible for Universal Free School Meals, **but please remember that you must complete the application form to register for them.**
