We hope that everyone had a great summer break and that all the children are looking forward to achieving lots of 'Personal Bests' this year.

CONGRATULATIONS GREENFIELDS!

I am delighted to tell you that 2017 was yet another successful year for all of the children at Greenfields, who completed their national assessments at the end of last term.



- ☆ At the end of Reception, **84%** of our children achieved a Good Level of Development, higher than the national average of 71%.
- ☆ At the end of Year 1, **90%** of our children achieved the expected standard in the phonics check, higher than the national average of 81%.
- ☆ At the end of Year 2, **88%** of our children achieved the expected standard in all three of the end of Key Stage 1 assessments in Reading, Writing and Maths, higher than the national average of 64%.
- ☆ At the end of Year 6, **61%** of our children achieved the expected standard in all three of the end of Key Stage 2 assessments in Reading, Writing and Maths, which equalled the national average.

These are fabulous results, but what we are most proud about, is that we know that every single child did the best that they could do. **WELL DONE EVERYONE.**
