Feeling inspired, the children have now started to design their own inventions.

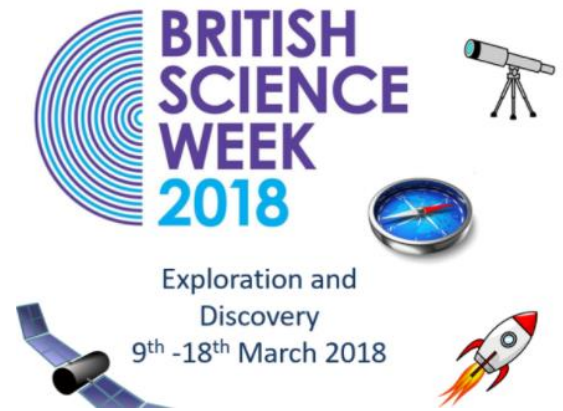
