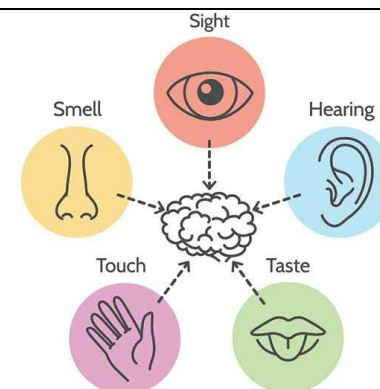

What if our senses disappeared?



Communication and Language

- Begin to listen and do for a short span
- Respond to instructions involving two parts
- Follow a story without pictures and prompts
- Listen and respond to others in conversation
- Extend vocabulary by naming the five senses and exploring the meaning
- Use language to imagine and recreate roles in the bakery
- Use narrative in their play

Literacy

- Begin to form all the sounds of the alphabet using a cursive style from the line
- Write own name confidently and independently
- Attempt to write captions using clearly identifiable letters
- Listen to the story of 'The Gingerbread Man' and ask and answer questions
- Hear initial sounds in words
- Segment and blend simple words and know which letters represent each sound
- Begin to read words
- Talk about a favourite book they've read

Physical Development

- Handle tools, such as scissors with increasing control
- Negotiate space successfully
- Move with increasing control
- Hold a pencil using a dominant hand
- Change independently into PE kit
- Try new food and talk about a healthy diet
- Go to the toilet independently

Understanding the World

- Identify and talks about events in own life
- Begin to differentiate between past and present
- Look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change
- Use ICT hardware to interact with age appropriate programs

Expressive Arts and Design

- Begin to build a repertoire of songs and dances
- Explore different textures
- Explore different sounds
- Create simple representations
- Play alongside others, engaging in the same theme
- Play cooperatively as part of a group to develop and act out a narrative

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Form positive relationships with adults and other children
- Explain own knowledge
- Ask appropriate questions
- Try new activities
- Aware of boundaries set and follow rules

Maths

- Recognise numerals 1-10
- Count confidently to 20
- Count objects 1-5, then 1-10, then 1-20
- Order numbers 1-20
- Count actions and objects which can't be moved
- Write numbers 1-5, then 1-10, then 1-20
- Select a number 1-20 correctly on the number line
- Begin to identify one more and one less
- Use everyday language related to time and money
- Order and sequence familiar events
- Measure short periods of time in simple ways
