

Communication and Language

- Respond to instructions involving two parts
- Follow a story without pictures and prompts
- Listen and respond to others in conversation
- Extend vocabulary by naming materials used to build houses
- Use language to imagine and recreate roles in the hotel
- Use narrative in their play

Physical Development

- Move with increasing control
- Try new food and talk about a healthy diet
- Begin to hold pencil confidently and correctly.
- Begin to show increasing control when catching, kicking and throwing.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Form positive relationships with adults and other children
- Explain own knowledge
- Ask appropriate questions
- Begin to discuss why they like activities more than others
- Take account of one another's ideas about how an activity is structured

Literacy

- Attempt to write captions using clearly identifiable letters
- Listen to the story of 'A Tiger Came to Tea' and ask and answer questions
- Role play familiar stories i.e. 'The Three Little Pigs'
- Segment and blend simple words and know which letters represent each sound
- Begin to read words
- Talk about a favourite book they've read

Understanding the World

- Identify and talks about events in own life
- Begin to differentiate between past and present
- Look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change
- Use ICT hardware to interact with age appropriate programs

Expressive Arts and Design

- Begin to build a repertoire of songs and dances
- Explore different materials
- Play cooperatively as part of a group to develop and act out a narrative

Maths

- Recognise numerals 1-20
- Count objects to 20
- Write numbers 1-10, then 1-20
- Select a number 1-20 correctly on the number line
- Begin to identify one more and one less
- Begin to estimate how many objects they can see
- Finds the total of two groups by counting them all
- Use everyday language related to time and money
- Order and sequence familiar events
