WORLD BOOK DAY 2019

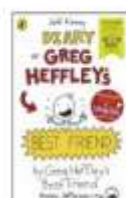
Everyone looked fabulous in their costumes yesterday and received their World Book Day book token.

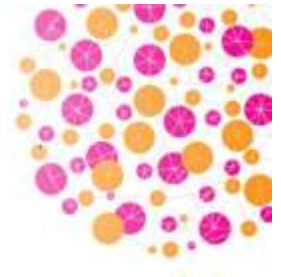
BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK
