Well done to all of them ~ they should be very proud of their achievements.

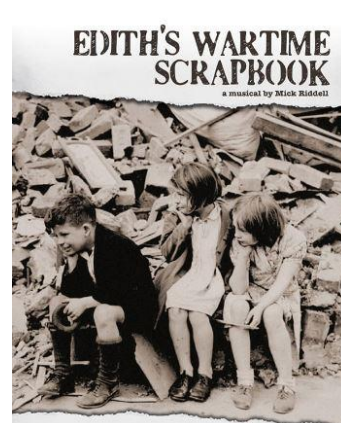
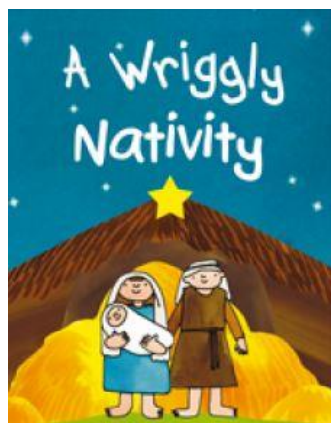


END OF TERM PERFORMANCES

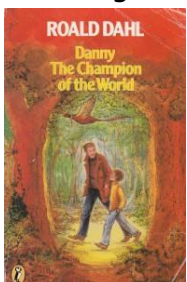
Congratulations to Class 5JI,
