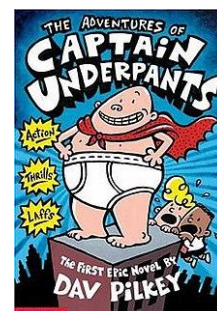

## FINALLY . . . 7 BILLION IDEAS 2020

As you know, one of our curriculum priorities is **Aspiration** because we want all children to achieve their potential, so we aim to provide experiences that show them the wide range of possibilities available for their future, including further education and the World of Work.

Linked to this, we asked 7billionideas and North Tyneside Learning Trust into school on Monday to launch their 2020 competition to find the most creative ideas that might just change the world.

The competition, which is now in its third year, is designed to inspire innovators and entrepreneurs of the future, encouraging pupils to generate a variety of world changing ideas in areas such as the environment, health, technology and sport. Ideas from past competitions include a car that sucks up pollution and turns it into energy and a GPS connected earpiece that helps visually impaired people find their way around.



To take part, children need to work in teams of three to develop their ideas before creating posters, models, musical jingles and presentations. Eventually, one team from each school will be chosen to go through to the 2020 final where one overall winner will be chosen.

For the last two years, one of our teams has got through to the final and we are really looking forward to being part of it again this year. Miss Smith will be running an Ideas club on Wednesday lunchtimes, starting next week, to get the project up and running.
