

Appointment letters have been sent out this week - please return the slip at the bottom of your letter as soon as possible, so that we can allocate time slots.


## LOVE READING!

Here are this week's reading recommendations from staff and children . . .

### Miss Evans recommends *Skellig* by David Almond

"I love this book as it starts out with a completely normal boy doing completely normal things that we can all recognise – moving house, going to a new school, worrying about his family – but he then discovers something totally unexpected in the garage which transforms his life.

This was the first David Almond book I read, and I have been hooked ever since, as all his books stay with you long after you have finished them. I also love the fact that he lives just up the road from here – you might even bump into him on the street!"



### 4GH recommends *The Velvet Fox* by Catherine Fisher

"This book is our class reader and we absolutely love it! Lots of us have even bought our own copies so that we can read along. Here are some of the reasons why:
