## 12<sup>th</sup> MAY DIARY PROJECT

2020 is the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the 12<sup>th</sup> May Diary Project and the Mass Observation Archive are repeating its annual call for one-day diaries, capturing the everyday lives of people across the UK. The written diaries will be stored in the Archive at The Keep and be used by a wide range of people for research, teaching and learning.



In 1937 Mass Observation called for people from all parts of the UK to record everything they did from when they woke up in the morning to when they went to sleep at night on 12<sup>th</sup> May. This was the day of George VI's Coronation. The resulting diaries provide a wonderful glimpse into the everyday lives of people across Britain and have become an invaluable resource for those researching countless aspects of the era.

In 2020, the MOA would really welcome diaries from school children, community groups, or other organisations. This may be an activity for children and families during the current time of home working and homeschooling. Diaries can be written in any style and can include drawings.

## LOVE READING!

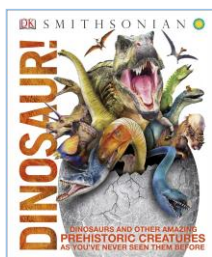

Here are this week's reading recommendations . . . from the children:

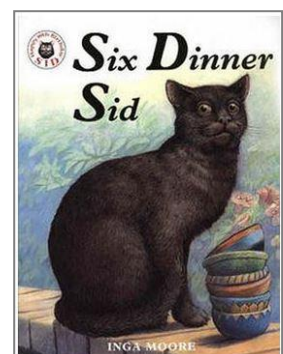

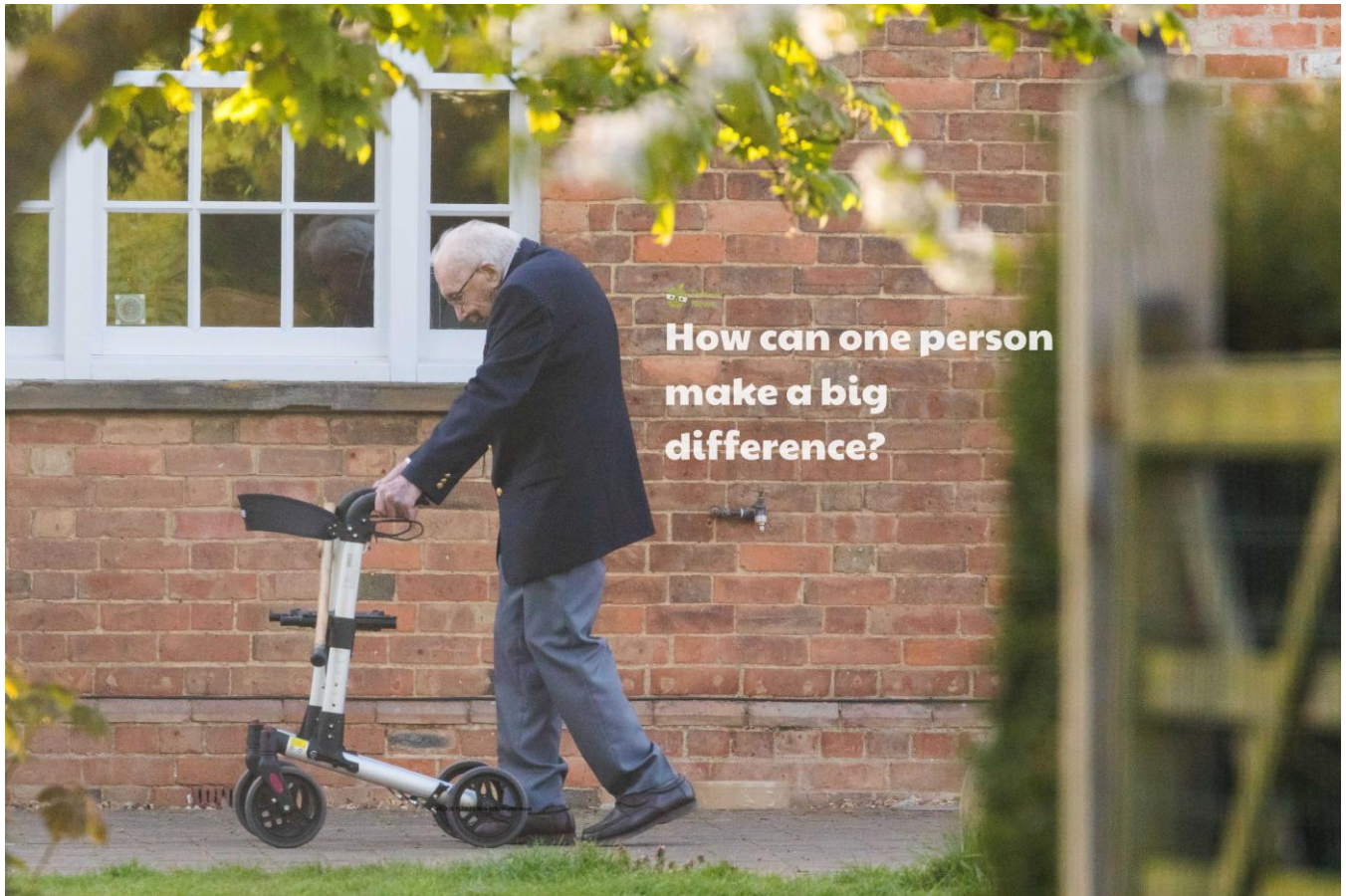




## IN THE NEWS THIS WEEK
